Today, James and Maya are one of five hardworking Greater Boston families whose dream of affordable homeownership is becoming a reality, thanks to generous supporters like you.

The five families cannot wait to get started partnering with Habitat Greater Boston's staff and volunteers to build their future homes in Malden.

In the coming weeks, these families will wrap up the orientation process and get to work on contributing between 250 and 300 hours of sweat equity. They will also start classes to prepare them for all the responsibilities and opportunities that come with homeownership.

While we could not be happier to welcome these incredible families into the homeownership program, the selection process offered a stark reminder of the enormous toll that the housing crisis is having on our region. More than 80 families throughout Greater Boston applied for these five homes.

With your continued support, we are planning to welcome 7 more families into our homeownership program this year. Together, we can do even more to confront the housing crisis and help as many families as possible to access affordable homeownership right here in Greater Boston.

They are looking forward to baking goodies in their new kitchen and taking long walks in the neighborhood as a family. "We will accomplish something that was unattainable for our family," James said.

Partner family shares their experience in new video

Nearly seven years after moving into the home they helped build alongside Habitat Greater Boston staff and volunteers, Stephen and Arlene are still amazed to be homeowners.

"We're so happy,"Stephen says in a new video about their experience with affordable homeownership. "Me and my wife, we always say, 'Thank God for Habitat. Thank God for all the people who make it possible for us to own a house."

Before partnering with Habitat Greater Boston, Stephen and Arlene were living in a cramped, two-bedroom attic apartment and unable to find affordable options for a home of their own. Today, they live in a townhouse with plenty of space for their family. They have a permanent home among a close-knit community of neighbors.

"It means so much to us, owning our own home, and it's really affordable," Arlene says. "Habitat made it possible for us. We're extremely happy for that."

Smiling on the couch in their sunny living room, Stephen agrees.

"This program is real," he says. "It's helped a lot of people that I know, my neighbors and me."

Bargain hunters, home redecorators, and do-it-yourselfers rejoice – finding deals at Habitat Greater Boston's ReStore just got easier than ever!

The West Roxbury retail outlet is wrapping up a full-scale reorganization, transforming the formerly cramped and maze-like space with open sight lines and wide aisles. This will allow customers to easily peruse the constantly changing inventory of everything that ReStore has to offer, from home appliances to lighting fixtures to china sets and more.

The effort will result in about 4,000 additional square feet of retail space, a dramatically improved experience for shoppers and staff alike. The new layout has already boosted sales significantly.

"There's so much more inventory on the floor," said Mark Auterio, Director of Business Strategy at the ReStore. "I have people coming in saying, 'This is a completely different store.' They are loving it."

Since opening in 2010, the ReStore has become a valuable community resource, offering a wide selection of donated gently used home goods at discounted prices.

Allen Yuen, a regular ReStore customer, praised the staff for rearranging the store and making it easier to navigate.

"I love coming in here – you can't beat it," he said. **"You're buying** stuff you need, and at the same time you're helping people accomplish the American dream." continued on page 4



Homeowner Services Coordinators, Abi and Chloe, facilitating Lottery for Malden homes!

Everything you always wanted to know about our family selection process:

Applications: When Habitat Greater Boston begins building new homes, our Homeowner Services staff members promote new homeownership opportunities in local communities. Families interested in participating in the program are encouraged to formally apply to be a partner with us. Our staff reviews the applications to see if families are eligible based on their work income, need for stable housing, and willingness to participate in first-time homeownership classes and complete 250 to 300 hours volunteering on the build site of their own home or that of other families.

Virtual interviews: Our staff and volunteer Homeowner Selection Committee members schedule virtual interviews with families eligible to participate to get to know them and explain the homeownership program further.

Home visits: Staff and Homeowner Selection Committee members visit with families at their homes to meet them in person, discuss the program requirements in more detail, and answer any remaining questions.

Lottery: All families are entered into a lottery in which names are chosen at random for each of the units that will be built. Eligible families who are not selected are encouraged to reapply for a future opening.

Board approval: Following the lottery, Habitat Greater Boston's Board of Directors meets to give final approval of the selection of families.
